

Against lock-in: building open ICT systems using standards Communication of the Commission

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Lock in: too high prices and too much dependence

- Many public authorities are locked into their ICT systems (build with proprietary technology) – few potential suppliers for follow up of system
- This results in too high prices (€0.7 to €1.4 billion per year for the whole public sector)
- Too high dependence on business decisions of supplier
- Might have the effect that stakeholders also need to use that same proprietary technology to communicate with public authority



Standards might help

- They make essential knowledge about a system available to anyone
- But many barriers for using standards:
 - It is complex to understand which standard to use in which situation
 - On the short term it might increase the cost of procuring new systems (while there might be savings on the long term)
 - And new ICT systems need to work with already existing systems. Resulting requests for backward compatibility might enforce the lock-in.
