

Karolis Granickas, Head of Europe at Open Contracting Partnership

"In public procurement, the voice of small companies really matters, as every government has to respond to SME requirements. Healthy procurement markets have 10% of innovation – currently we are not at that level – and startups can help governments achieve that."

"Governments approach startup collaboration through the lens of risk. As a startup, leverage that. Approach smaller municipalities and spot the best way in, this usually looks like a hotspot of different actors. We need to work cross sector and across Government agencies when we do GovTech."

Don't expect quick wins, be patient and do the homework when it comes to understanding the trends. Certain municipalities and cities are more interested in testing out new technologies and solutions than others."
