Public law framework agreement on eGovernment cooperation (2008; 2015; 2016-2019)

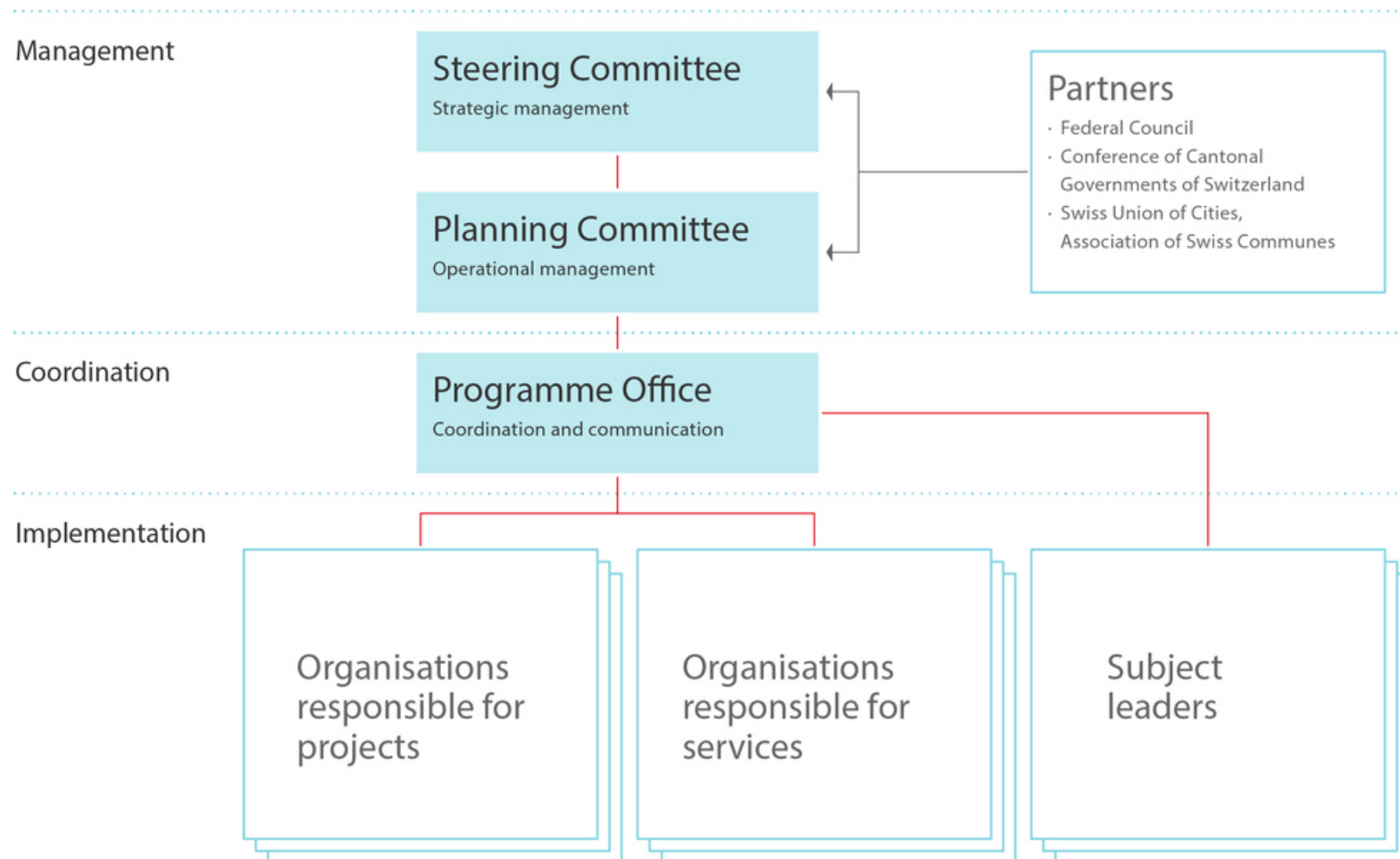
- Composition, tasks and responsibilities

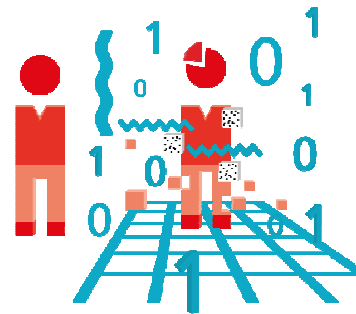
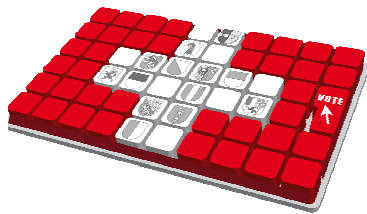

- Lays the foundation for a joint organisation supported by the Swiss Confederation, the Cantons and the Communes
- Acts as an organisational body and competent service provider of the administration across all federal levels
- Objectives until 2019
 - Establishment of the infrastructure and project management
 - Pilot operation with two services
 - Drawing up the foundation agreement and principles for formal establishment
