







User from Spain: LEOS will help us make the drafting of legal texts more efficient



Interview with Carlos Fernandez, Project Manager at Ministry of the Presidency, Relations with the Parliament and Democratic Memory Spain

LEOS is a software tool helping those involved in drafting legislation, which is usually a complex process requiring efficient online collaboration. Comments, suggestions, version control, co-edition, everything is possible with LEOS. The software was released as open source and has developed a growing community around. One of the active community members and a user of LEOS is Carlos Fernandez from the Spanish Ministry of the Presidency, Relations with the Parliament and Democratic Memory.

Can you tell us a bit about yourself and the ministry?

My institution is, among other things, responsible for the quality of drafting legal texts generated by Spanish government and relations with the Parliament and the Senate. In our department, we manage all information systems used to fulfill these responsibilities, and LEOS will help us make the drafting of legal texts more efficient.

As a project manager of LEOS in Spain, I am responsible for the organisation of the necessary resources. I ensure that everybody involved in the project can contribute with their specific skills to define and develop the requirements for LEOS in our administration.

How did you find out about LEOS?

At the ministry, we needed a tool to support the activities of our office responsible for the quality of drafting legal texts.

We searched for open source tools used in the European Union and LEOS arose as the best option.

Testing EdiT, the European Commission instance of LEOS

EdiT, the European Commission instance of LEOS that will replace LegisWrite, was recently tested in Directorate-General for Taxation and Custom Union (DG TAXUD). CEND and LEOS team spoke to one its first users, policy officer Milagros Calvo Vergez (DG TAXUD), and to Veerle Cumps (Secretariat-General). Who supported and quided all the Directorate -Generals (DGs) involved in this test phase.

DG TAXUD tested EdiT, the new legislative editor, first. Why was that?

MCV. I had gone to the first presentations and trainings by the Secretariat-General, which leads this project, and I was convinced that EdiT - with its many user-friendly features - would be a very useful tool for us. In DG TAXUD we were just about to start drafting a legislative proposal, so the timing couldn't have been better! That's why I suggested it to my hierarchy and started the ball rolling...

What are your first impressions of EdiT?

MCV. Its really a great tool for collaboration. It compiles all the comments for you, from all those involved, in our case we had the Legal Service, the editing unit of Directorate-General for Translation and the services in many other DGs – 18 DGs in total. There were around 600 annotations we had to go through, imagine wading through all the separate answers by the different DGs and collecting those annotations from a whole series of Word documents! I think our project had just about the right complexity to test the system.

VC: Actually, we had hoped for even more comments by the DGs, but I think DG TAXUD had prepared their project too well (laughs). It was my role to guide the DGs during the interservice consultation phase in Decide, a workflow tool supporting the Commission decision-making process from planning to adoption – which is now interoperable with EdIT.

As the two systems communicate with each other, the lead DG working on the legislative proposal gets all the observations, comments and suggestions posted through 'Decide Consultation' in one place, in EdIT.

LEOS as an educational tool for public administrators


Legislation Editing Open Software (LEOS) is a free software tool that facilitates the editing/reviewing of legislative texts and generates legislation produced in an interoperable format. Dr. Fotis Fitsilis, member of the Scientific Service in the Hellenic Parliament, used LEOS to educate the future generations of public officials.

Legislative drafting is guided by principles and tradition, but the digital dimension is rapidly gaining significance. Legislatures, lawmakers and legal professionals gradually discover legal informatics as a scientific field capable of producing tools and services that have the potential to offer substantial assistance in the law making process.

The Hellenic National School of Public Administration and Local Government was among the first at a global scale to identify the need to educate the future generations of public officials in legal informatics patterns and tools. A legislative drafting laboratory was developed and the pilot course with ten students of the 'digital policy' special section took place in Spring/Summer term 2020. The Lab was based on a detailed, modular and hence reusable curriculum and was supported by a comprehensive manual exclusively developed for the number.

Dr. Fotis Fitsilis, member of the Scientific Service in the Hellenic Parliament and team leader of the Hellenic OCR Team, a crowdsourcing initiative for the processing and analysis of parliamentary data, designed and led the laboratory. Teaching included, among others, introduction to legislative drafting and discussion of legal informatics principles.

The use of XML for the generation of structured legal documents was explained as well as recent developments in ontologies and data schemes. In this regard, the <u>European Interoperability Framework</u> was shown, followed by a detailed analysis of the <u>European Legislation Identifier</u> and the Akoma Ntoso standard. A series of case studies displaying such systems at the <u>European Union level</u> and in the United States Congress was also presented.




