

Update on LEOS/EdiT in the Commission Roll-out of EdiT

- Implementation of cultural change
 - Different way of drafting and adopting legislation
 - Thousands of staff impacted
 - Set up a professional service function
 - Turning EdiT into a product
 - Develop the LEOS community
- 7 EdiT pilots/150 colleagues involved for drafting and adoption of 'real' acts
 - Close monitoring and pro-active support
 - · Very encouraging feedback: user-friendliness, intuitiveness, 'fit for purpose'
 - Gains in quality and efficiency

Update on LEOS/EdiT in the Commission Funding beyond 2022

- Draft a new proposal for funding LEOS under Digital Europe Programme in 2023-2024
- Adopt 'LEOS open-source first approach'
 - Use open-source development platform (GitLab)
 - Co-develop LEOS

- Review the LEOS governance structure
- Set up LEOS Open-Source Programme Office
- Reach out to Member States and bodies to promote LEOS and relevant standards (AKN4EU)
- Provide legal drafters and policy developers with information/data and smart 'algorithms'

Objectives of the study

political imperative to continuously improve the legislative process

necessity and desire to embrace and experiment innovation

in public administrations





Execution

Contractor **University of Bologna** Started on 1.1.2021 for a duration of 11 months

- Extensive desk **research/literature review**
- Broad **consultation** in the Commission
- Close **cooperation** between the Contractor and the Commission
- Focus on legal drafting and what is doable in the near future
- Provide concrete results that inspire and provide a glimpse of how smart IT can/will assist better law making inter alia by piloting use cases and developing mock-ups



General learnings - summary

- We are at the verge of a paradigm shift brought about by 'Machine Processable Law'
- A promising new concept referred to in the study as 'Law as a Platform' is emerging. This
 considers the unique characteristics of law-making, and is based on different disciplines
 including philosophy of law, legal informatics and e.g. computational linguistics
- The value of (and obstacles for) of an integrated IT eco-system with an augmented LEOS at its core
- The need for human oversight and a hybrid Al approach
- The potential of technology/innovation is huge and the time is to act is now!



What is next?

- Make the study results known, discuss their implications and the possible next steps
- Fulfil identified preconditions starting by ensuring management engagement
- Address identified roadblocks with a high alertness on ethical issues
- Elaborate and implement an action plan. This should at least include
 - A detailed communication plan,
 - Do further work on (and identification of) additional uses cases close to the business, and
 - Set-up of a multi-disciplinary team to take an agenda forward


What if, LEOS would help with the drafting itself ? Helping the user on the content he adds...?


