



Public Sector Procedures in Greece



- Not fully described or documented
- Poor maintenance of relevant information
- Broad & multiple interpretations



- public servants: don't know what / how to implement
- citizens/ business: delays / uncertainty





Proposed Solution


- Use of open, standardized and widely available tools like MediaWiki
- Customisation
- Training activities
- Crowdsourcing of procedure documentation and maintenance

Results

- Development of a community of over 500 Public Servants to maintain the procedures
- Collaboration with 3 major Greek Universities
- Organisation of over 20 workshops for public servants and developers
- Documentation of over 2000 procedures













GSoC is a global program focused on introducing students to open source software development. Students work on a 3 month programming project with an open source organization during their break from university.

2017: 4 Open Source Projects


2018: 10 Open Source Projects



Project Idea and Objectives:

- Create an educational program for mixed classes in order to teach youth digital skills with the use of open technologies.
- Provide refugee youth who are not in school or have no access to other educational activities with a solid foundation in digital & tech skills.
- Provide a shared space for refugee and Greek youth to interact, learn and work together on digital projects.
- Create an inspiring learning environment where youth are encouraged to learn, connect and problem-solve



Program Setup:

- Educational material in english, openly licensed and available online in moodle as an open educational resource freely for everyone to reuse, modify and redistribute
- Set up of Open Labs using laptops, 3d printers, robotic kits etc.
- Free snacks and transportation for participants
- Social activities
- Gender and cultural balance within the class
- Free lab day for experimentation







Implementation:

- May 2017 Ongoing
- More than 350 beneficiaries
- 8 Courses (Python, Robotics & IoT, Web Design & Digital Content Creation, Office Automation, WEB II Advanced design course, Web Design & Web Development, 3D printing with circuits & Arduino, Basic ICT Skills)
