
Under the <u>law 4635/2019</u> is foreseen the development of a Single digital public administration portal, 'gov.gr', gathering all digital public services under one single portal, and the development of the open Single Digital Map which will collect and centralise geospatial data.

Infrastructure

The first version of the <u>central governmental portal (gov.gr)</u> was launched in March 2020 by the Ministry of Digital Governance and collects all the 507 services provided digitally by the State.


