

Political Communications

On 17 April 2020 the <u>policy letter on open source software</u> was sent to Parliament. The policy introduces open by default principle for software (comply or explain) and describes conditions and exceptions.

Governance

OBDO, through its Programming board is responsible for the coordination of digital government infrastructure, while Logius manages most digital government infrastructural services. BFS manages the standards while ICTU manages the Netherlands Government Reference Architecture (NORA).

Legislation


On 18 February 2020, the House of Representatives passed the <u>Digital Government bill</u>. The proposal was submitted by the Minister of the Interior and Kingdom Relations. The House of Representatives also adopted an amendment on online identity.

Infrastructure

Connected to the publication of NL DigiBeter2.0, the <u>policy</u> <u>framework for the digital government basic infrastructure</u> was published. It includes principles for developing the policy for the digital government basic infrastructure and for further developing its generic functions.
