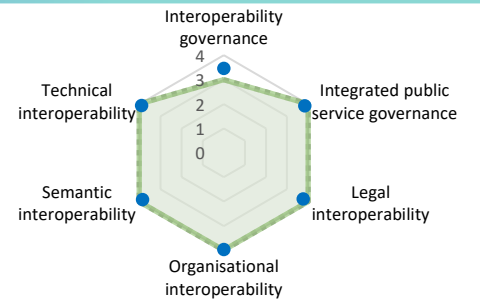
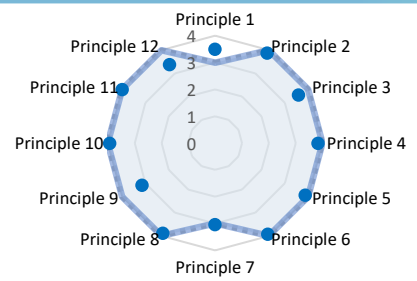

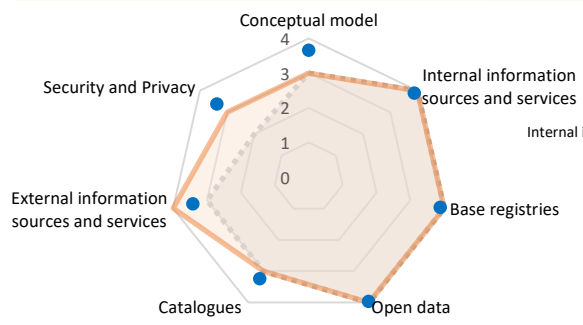
SCOREBOARD 1 TWELVE PRINCIPLES SCOREBOARD 2 INTEROPERABILITY LAYERS



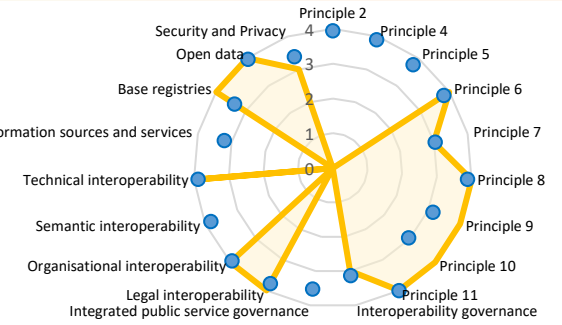

Latest Initiatives

A new Estonian interoperability framework will be launched in 2023, replacing the more than ten-year-old framework. The new interoperability framework will be a more 'live' than legislative document to introduce changes more frequently. The new framework will not be made mandatory across the government, instead as a suggested principles and guidance document. This allows the document to provide value to domains where some of the principles would not apply. More information on how the service is developed [here](#).

No recent changes in legislations have been reported to date.

In 2023, the National Data Portal will be ready. The objectives are to publish descriptions of datasets, publish and encourage the reuse of semantic assets (i.e. vocabularies, ontologies), publish information on reuse, etc. In addition, in 2022, an application to anonymise personal data was published, aiming at an even more secure training of bureaucratic contacts. The [Data Anonymise app](#) will have the ability to identify personal identifiers such as names, IDs and locations of individuals from the text and can replace with another value of the same entity class.

No recent changes in governance have been reported to date.
