Governance

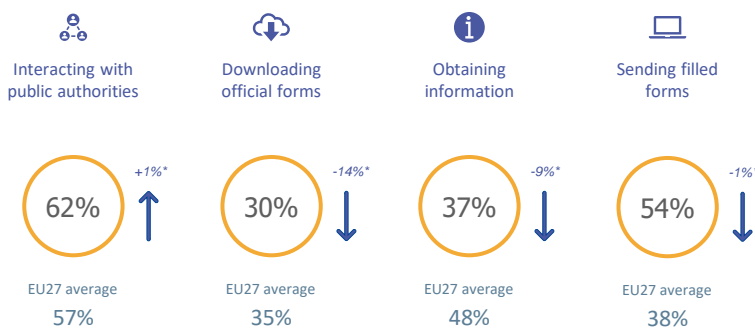
The [Office of the Government Chief Information Officer](#) (OGCIO), a division of the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform, has the leadership role for the digital agenda across Government.

Infrastructure

In 2020, Ireland continued to implement and expand [gov.ie](#), a central portal for online government services. Activity on gov.ie has increased substantially over the past year or so, with numbers of visitors increasing from 6 million in 2019 to over 97 million in 2020.

Percentage of individuals using the internet for

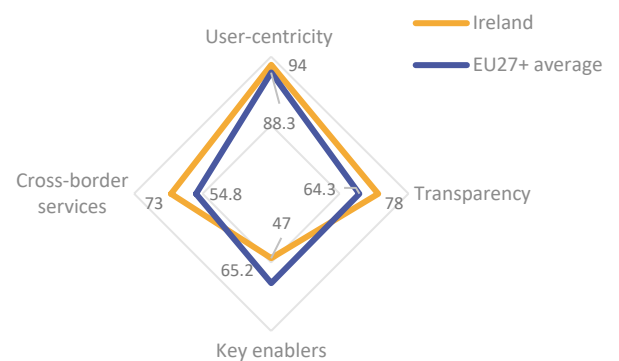

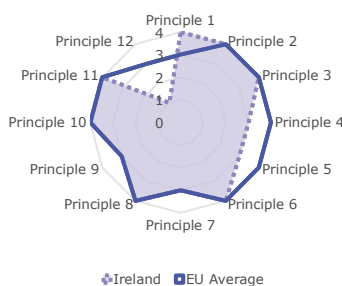
eGovernment performance across policy priorities



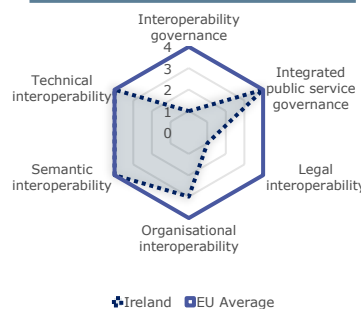

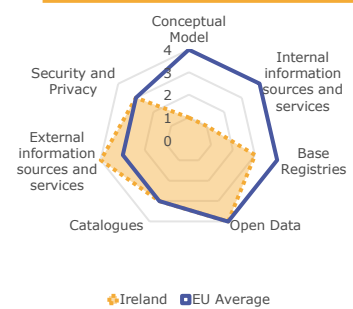
SCOREBOARD 1 TWELVE PRINCIPLES
