Governance

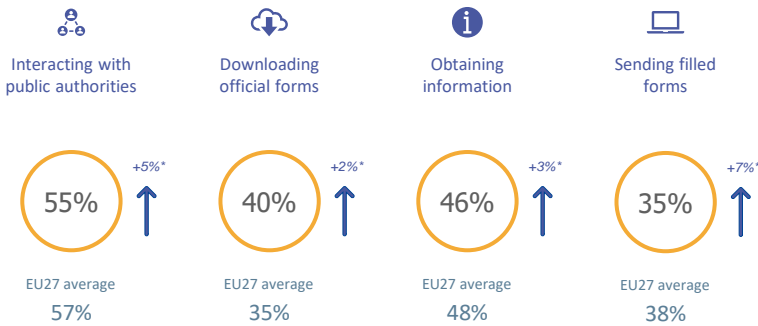

Percentage of individuals using the internet for

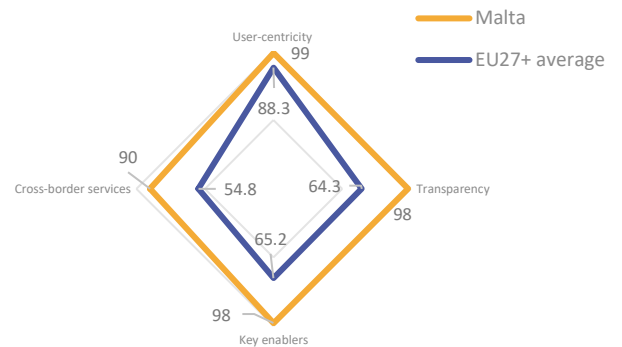

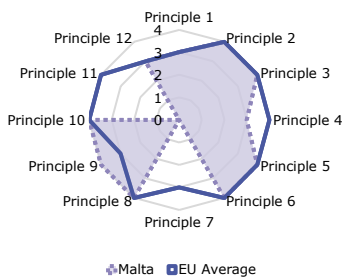
eGovernment performance across policy priorities



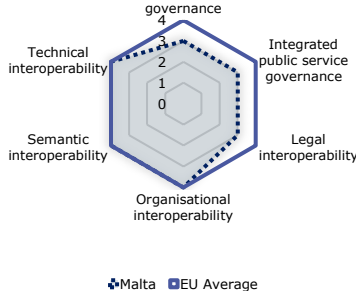

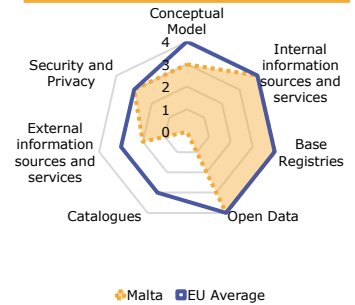
SCOREBOARD 1 TWELVE PRINCIPLES
