### Governance

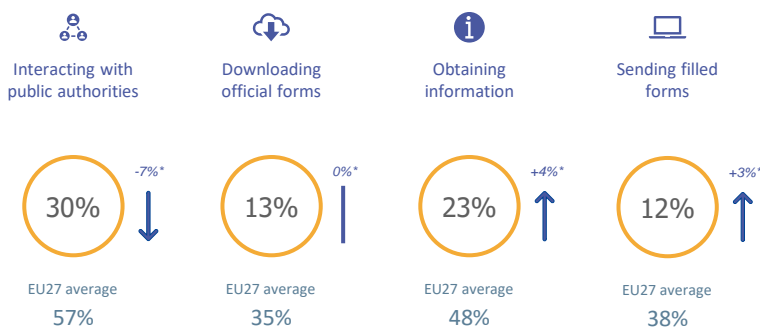
In December 2020, Ms Tamara Srzentić was appointed as the new Minister of Public Administration, Digital Society and Media.

Percentage of individuals using the internet for

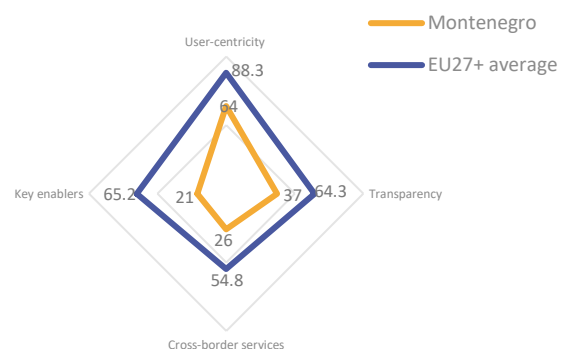

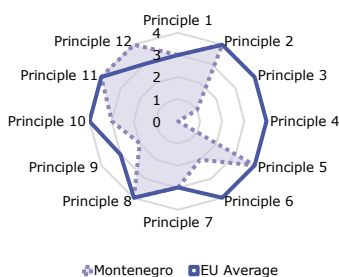
eGovernment performance across policy priorities



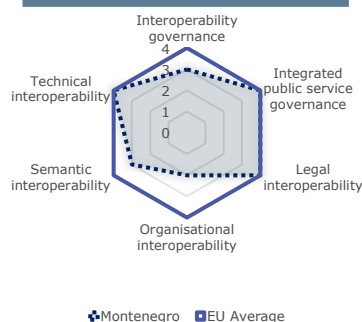

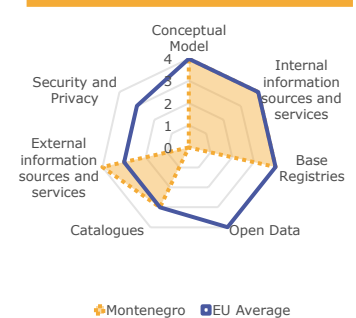
### SCOREBOARD 1 TWELVE PRINCIPLES
