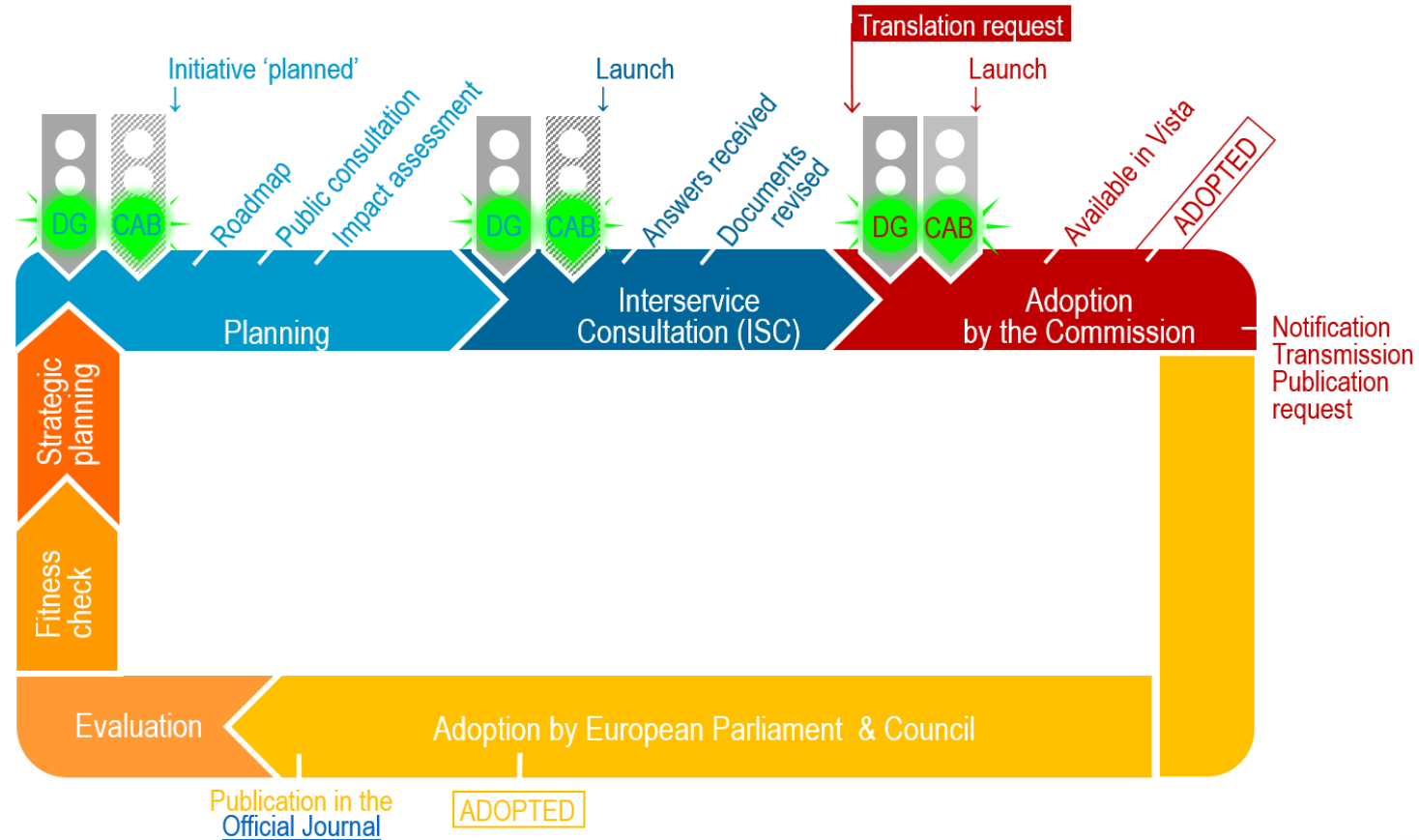

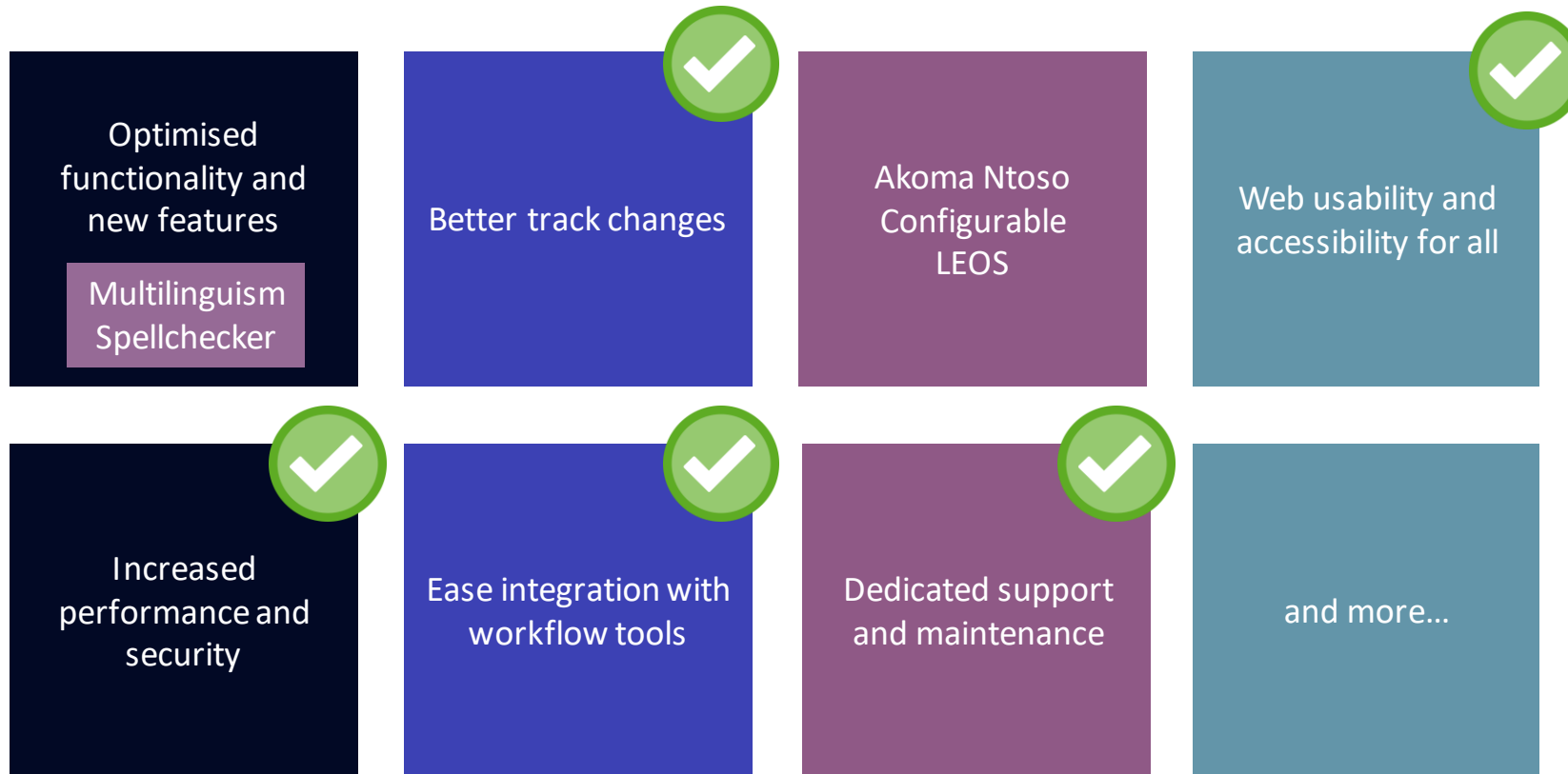

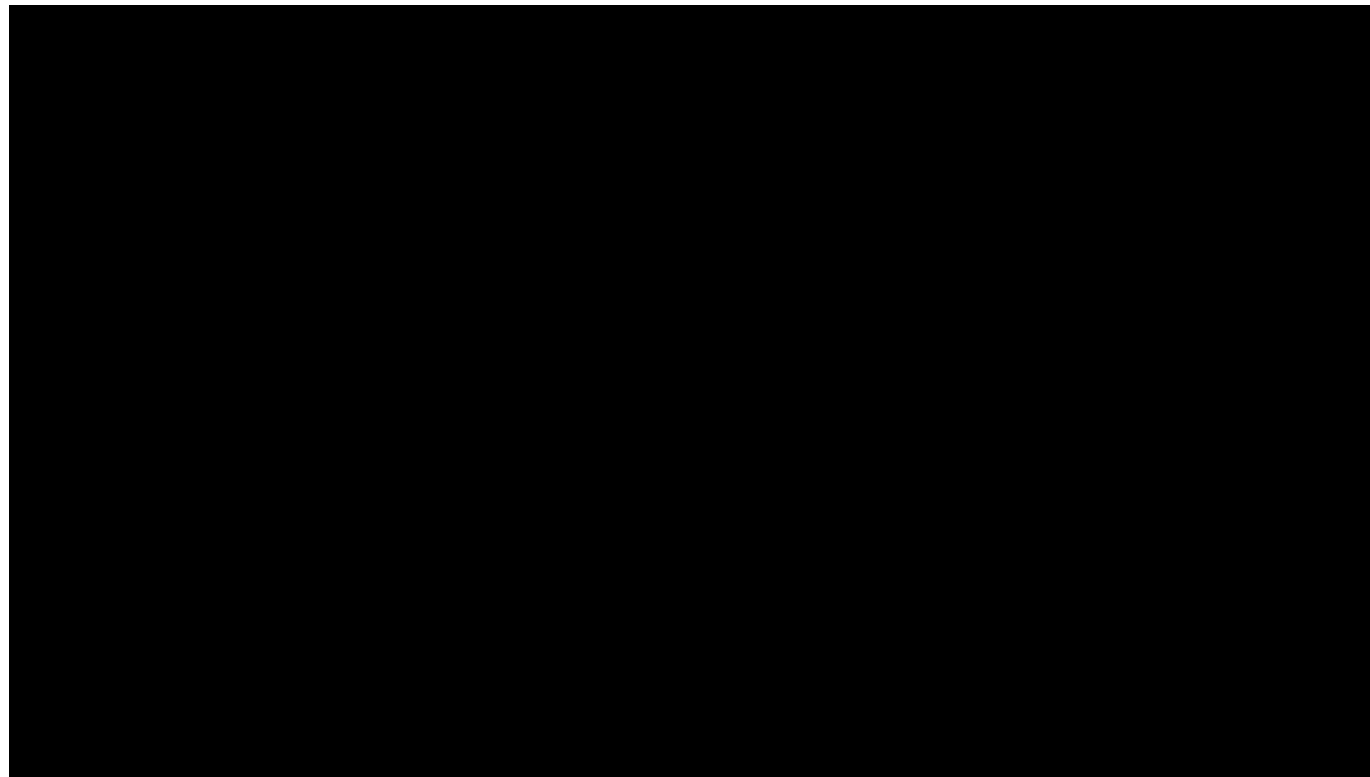

# Open-source Commission strategy

## Adopted on 21 October 2020

- ‘Wherever possible and appropriate, the Commission would share the source code for any computer programs where it holds the intellectual property rights on behalf of the EU’

## Framework for distributing open-source software

- The default open-source license should be the European Union Public License (EUPL)
- The steps to open-source distribution include
  - Software identification process
  - Intellectual Property clearance
  - Vulnerability assessment

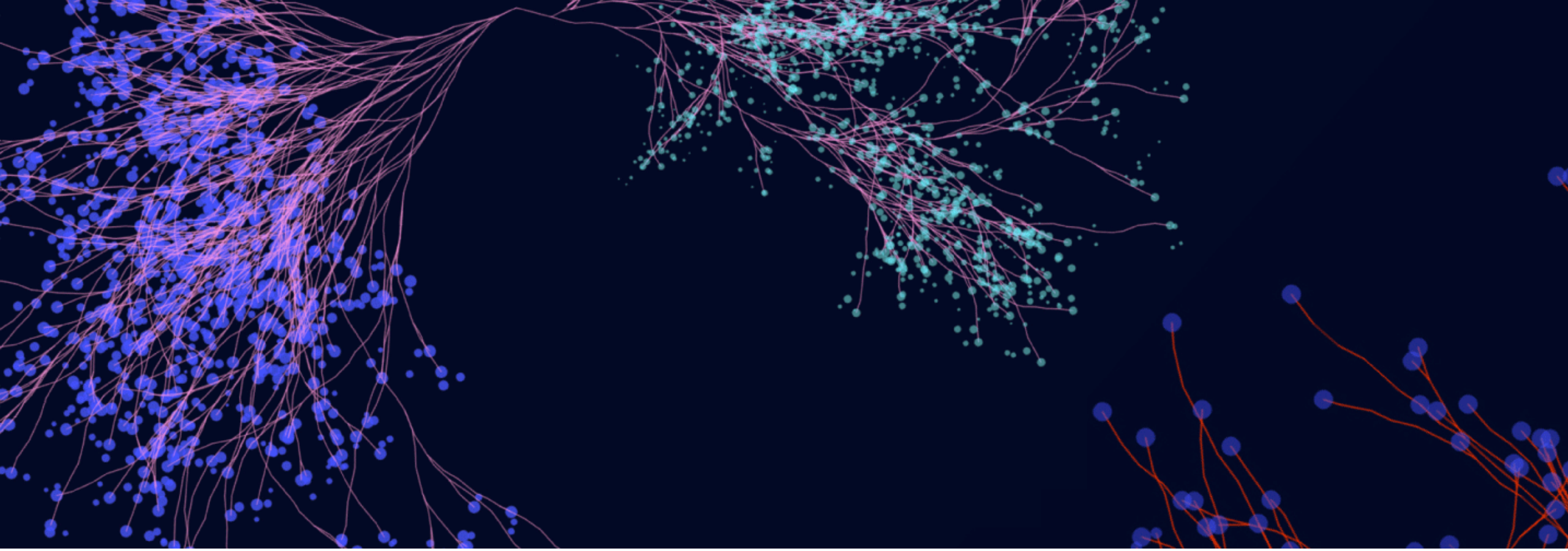
